



Kenya Pre-Export Verification of Conformity (PVoC) Program

Ensuring Compliance and Efficient Market Entry into Kenya

In order to maintain product safety and protect public interest, the Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) has implemented the Pre-Export Verification of Conformity (PVoC) program. This regulatory framework requires exporters to verify compliance with applicable Kenyan standards prior to shipment.

All regulated products destined for the Kenyan market must undergo conformity assessment in the country of export and obtain a Certificate of Conformity (CoC). The CoC serves as official evidence that the goods meet Kenya's mandatory technical and safety requirements and facilitates smooth customs clearance upon arrival.

The PVoC program plays a vital role in preventing the importation of substandard, counterfeit, or unsafe goods while supporting a fair and competitive trading environment. By ensuring compliance before shipment, the scheme minimizes clearance delays, reduces the risk of rejections or penalties, and enhances predictability in cross-border trade.

As an approved inspection body under the KEBS PVoC program, TÜV Rheinland conducts product evaluations including inspection, testing, and issuing the Certificate of Conformity to verified exporters. This structured and transparent process enables businesses to access the Kenyan market efficiently and with full regulatory confidence.

The CoC is a compulsory document for all regulated products entering Kenya and must be presented to the Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) to complete the customs clearance process.

PROGRAM AIMS

- To ensure quality of products, health and safety, and environmental protection for consumers
- Promote fair competition by ensuring only compliant products enter the Kenya market
- To facilitate trade by ensuring that compliant goods are given expedited clearance at the port of entry
- To enhance efficiency of clearance of imported goods at the ports of entry
- To prevent deceptive trade practices

REGULATED PRODUCT SCOPES UNDER KENYA PVOC PROGRAM

All goods are regulated under the Kenya Pre-Export Verification of Conformity (PVOC) program. Products classified as exempted, prohibited, or restricted are excluded from the PVOC requirement. The list of products below provides an indication of product categories that are typically subject to the PVOC program. However, as product classification may vary, it is recommended to consult one of our experts for confirmation.

* Used vehicles, used spare parts, and mobile equipment are covered by a different inspection agency under the Kenya PVOC Program
 ** Second-hand textiles and footwear must comply with a protocol established by KEBS. A key requirement of this protocol is the assessment of baling and sorting facilities in the country of export to ensure compliance with the applicable standards.

Note: Certain high-risk shipments destined for Kenya—such as food products, cosmetics, toys, electrical and electronic items, as well as fertilizers and soil conditioners— may require a Free Sale Certificate (FSC) issued by the country of export or origin. A Free Sale Certificate issued by an authorized agency demonstrating that the product is freely sold and compliant with the applicable regulatory requirements in the country of origin/export. 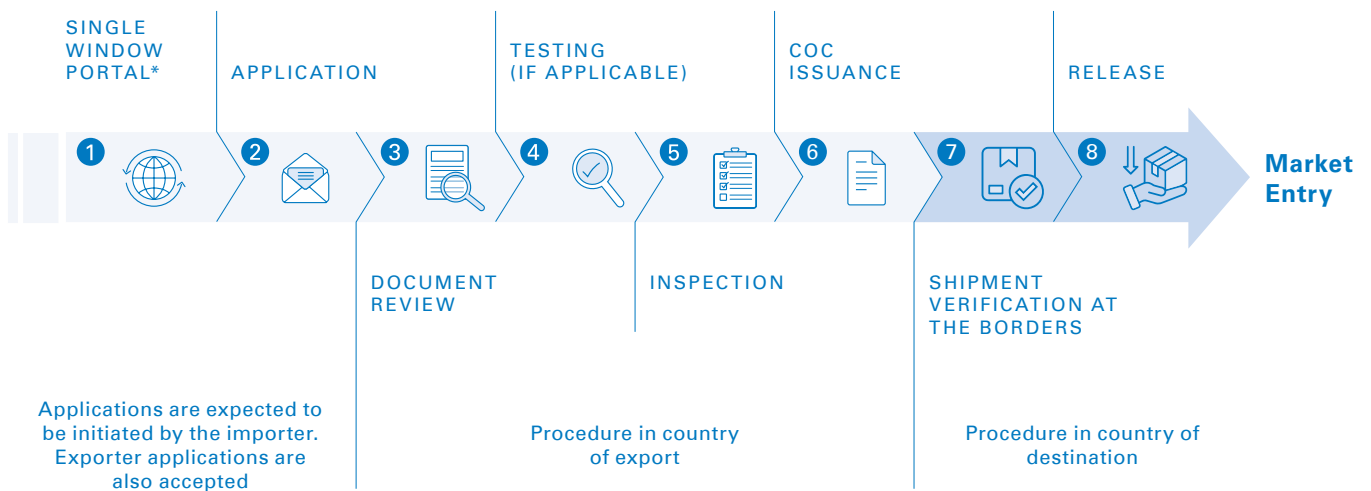

CERTIFICATION ROUTES UNDER THE KENYA PVOC

Depending on the exporter’s profile, shipment type, and product compliance history, the PVoC program offers three routes for certification:

- **Route A:** Consignment Inspection and Testing
Supervision of container loading and container sealing are mandatory for all shipments originating from China and the UAE.
- **Route B:** Product Registration
Designed for frequent exporters of homogeneous products with a strong compliance history, this scheme offers reduced surveillance assessments during the validity period of the registration.
- **Route C:** Product Licensing
Designed for manufacturers with a strong Quality Management System. After a factory audit evaluating production processes and product testing, the program offers reduced surveillance for the three-year license period.

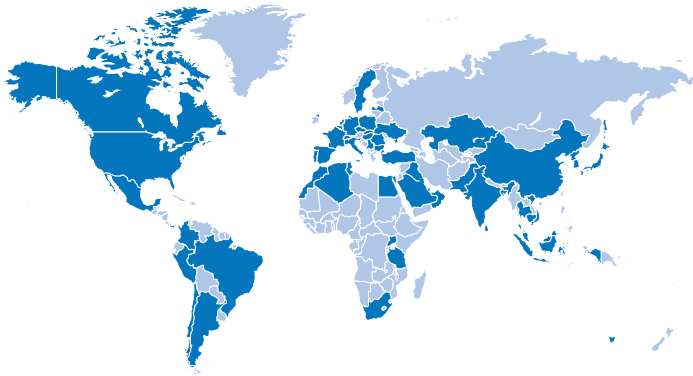
